

Whale tales bush walk

WEDNESDAY 30 SEPTEMBER – 9.30AM - 11.30AM

Take a walk with a Ranger through Tomaree's changing woodland and tea tree groves to rugged headlands with magnificent coastal views.

Look for whales from Morna Point and experience this wondrous fissured, time-worn headland with some of the most spectacular dykes and deep chasms in the park. Explore how life springs into action after recent fire.

Our Ranger will reveal tales of whales, fire and coastal life.

WHERE: Tomaree National Park, Boat Harbour area. Meet at the entrance to Tomaree National Park, off Tomaree Crescent.

WHAT TO BRING: You may like to bring binoculars. Please wear sturdy enclosed shoes (no open toed shoes) and protective clothing. Remember headlands can be windy.

COST: This is a specialty tour limited to 15 participants only. Adult \$25 Children 8-15 years \$15 Concession \$15 Family (2A, 2C) \$65 Children under 15 years must be accompanied by an adult.

This walk is unsuitable for children under 8 years due to safety concerns.

Minimum bookings apply for the tour to proceed.

GETTING THERE: From Nelson Bay travel south west along the Nelson Bay Road and turn into Gan Gan Road. At the roundabout on Gan Gan Road and Blanch Street, turn east into Blanch St, left into Graham St which ends at Boat Harbour Road.

The closest public toilets are near this junction.

Continue along Boat Harbour Road, turn right into Nelson Street and left into Tomaree Crescent.

Travel time is about 15 minutes from centre of Nelson Bay.
